AVA 2010 Northwest Regional Conference Alaska Adventure Tour Description

Travel to Denali National Park via First Class Rail

This tantalizing mini-tour takes you to the grand mountain that defines Alaska and the abundant wildlife that thrives in Denali National Park. The matchless vistas showcased aboard our luxurious first class, double decked, dome ceiling rail cars and the kind of service that goes above and beyond to enhance your adventure.

This trip begins in Anchorage at the Alaska Railroad Depot on First Avenue. Several miles into the trip, the heavy birch forests of Eagle River and Chugiak lead to the Knik and Matanuska Rivers. The expansive watershed harbors wildlife like moose, bear, the occasional wolf and abundant waterfowl. About 40 miles from Anchorage comes the Matanuska Valley, Alaska's agricultural center and home to the towns of Palmer and Wasilla. Just south of Talkeetna, 70 miles further, the first view emerges of Mt. McKinley, North America's highest peak. The train takes its first stop in Talkeetna, a small town with a mining history and now, a popular takeoff point for climbers to Mt. McKinley. From Talkeetna, the track follows the serpentine banks of the Susitna River. On clear days, more views of Mt. McKinley emerge across the river presenting many chances for photos. Black and brown bear frequent the sandbars and scuttle into the brush as the train approaches. Next, the Indian River Canyon is home to many beavers and beaver lodges can be seen in the ponds along the way. The track climbs toward tree line, first crossing Hurricane Gulch, the longest bridge on the railroad just over 914 feet and 296 feet above Hurricane Creek. The train moves into Broad Pass, at 2,363 feet it's the highest point on the railroad, and where caribou migrate through during the fall. This fantastic rail journey ends at the Denali National Park, Alaska Railroad depot where shuttle bus will transfer you to your hotel.

A full day of rail travel can work up an appetite, so after settling in at the hotel, we'll visit Cabin Nite Dinner Theater, for the hearty food, terrific music, talented performers and an Alaskan-sized helping of fun! You'll hear colorful stories of the great Alaskan Gold Rush while you enjoy our all-you-can-eat family-style meal in an authentic roadhouse. An early evening is advised as another adventure awaits early the next day. Overnight at one of the finest lodges at Denali National Park. Early in the morning embark on the Tundra Wilderness Tour, a seven to nine hour journey into the wilds of Denali. Spend a day and travel almost 60 miles into the wilderness of Denali National Park and the heart of bear country. On this fully-guided tour, you'll get interpretation from your driver/guide, along with hours of wildlife spotting and spectacular scenery. If the weather cooperates, you'll see Mount McKinley up close. You'll return back to your hotel mid afternoon. Overnight at the lodge. The next day, board the 9:20am shuttle from the Denali Park Visitors Center to the Denali Park Headquarters for a dog sled demonstration hosted by the National Park Service. Return on the 10:45 shuttle and prepare to re-board your first class domed railcars and return to Alaska's largest city, Anchorage, retracing your journey along the scenic Parks Highway. Upon returning to Anchorage, a deluxe motorcoach will provide transportation from the railroad depot to the University of Alaska campus.

1. Airline Reservations: Do this first. Do this Now.

Arrival day: Friday, July 30 or Monday-Tuesday, August 2-3

If going on the Denali National Park Tour (July 30-Aug 2)...plan on arriving in Anchorage on Friday, July 30, by early afternoon. Call Comfort Inn courtesy phone in airport baggage area for a free shuttle ride to the hotel.

Otherwise, plan on arriving in Anchorage on Monday afternoon, August 2, or Tuesday morning, August 3, by Noon. The University Lakes and Trails 5km and 10 km Walks start between 9:00 AM and Noon on August 3. The Volksswim starts at 4:00 PM that afternoon. Take a taxi from the Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport to the UAA Commons, 3700 Sharon Gagnon Lane...a distance of 7 miles due east. Fare will be about \$22.00.

Departure day: Sunday, August 8

Last meal is 7:00 AM Breakfast at UAA. Choice of two Walks in morning starting at 8:30 AM. Motorcoach transportation to Anchorage Airport with your luggage will be provided at the following times from UAA Commons: 12 Noon – 12:45 PM – 1:30 PM – 2:15 PM – 3:00 PM – 3:45 PM (final run)

Plan for an afternoon or evening flight that day. Overnight lodging at UAA is not available.

The Conference fee is set at \$ 300 per person. It includes **program fees** (rental of facilities, special entertainment, the Portage Glacier Cruise, admissions to the Begich, Boggs Visitor Center, Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center, Alaska Native Heritage Center, and the Anchorage Museum); **bus transportation** (Premier Alaska Tours motorcoaches for out of town locations and First Student school buses for in town locations); **special meal costs** Sourdough Mining Company buffet dinner and The Hotel Alyeska banquet buffet; **custom-designed conference items** (choice of hat or visor plus 3-inch circular embroidered emblem plus tag less cotton T-shirt); and **miscellaneous expense** (promotion, printing, postage and freight charges, supplies including name badges, contingency).

Between what you pay to UAA for housing and meals (item 3 and what you pay to our club (the conference fee)...almost all of your expense is covered except for the following items: Thurs and Fri lunches, bike rentals (\$16 and \$15), Alyeska Aerial Tram ticket (\$14.50), and bus ticket to Glen Alps for optional Thurs walk (\$10).

NOTE: There is no need for you to rent a car in Anchorage for the conference.

All requests for cancellation must be postmarked or sent electronically **by no later than May 31, 2010**. There will be a **\$35 administrative fee** deducted for all refunds. Your conference fee may be transferred to a replacement in lieu of a refund without an administrative fee.
